WOMEN IN WELDING

In partnership with the Government of South Australia's 'Skilling South Australia initiative', Adelaide Training and Employment Centre (ATEC) and Naval Group Australia have developed this program, aiming to boost female participation in the 'Attack Class' submarine workforce and therefore support women in an exciting new career of welding.

This short program offers entry level accredited training, at no cost, in skills needed to start a career as a top-class welder. Participants who then choose to pursue a welding career, will have the opportunity to be considered for a new intake of Naval Group Australia apprenticeships, commencing a pathway to a decades-long career working on 'Attack Class' submarines.

MAS National has also joined Naval Group Australia and ATEC to support candidates wanting to enter a welding career through other fields, by linking candidates through their national apprenticeship network database.

The program will consist of both theory and practical training to familiarise you with the tools and tasks of professional welding through hands-on experience with power tools, the performance of manual metal arc welding and a real feel for the industry with introductions to employers in Naval Group Australia's host business network.



Information session

Once you have expressed your interest you will be invited to an information session, you will receive detailed information on the program itself as well as your potential future career with Naval Group Australia. This will be your opportunity to ask all the questions you have to determine if this career path is for you!

On completion of this information session, you will be asked, if interested, to complete your application to be considered for selection with in the 10 limited spaces.

Entry Requirements

Participants **MUST**:

- Be 18 years or older
- Be an Australian/New Zealand Citizen or hold a eligible VISA
- Have the ability to read, write and understand basic English and carry out basic mathematical calculations.
- Be physically able to perform practical fabrication skills.

Enrolment Session

If successfully chosen, you will be required to book and attend an enrolment session where you will need to complete the following:

- Uniform measurements/order *(provided free of charge)*
- Undertake a Literacy and Numeracy Assessment (LLN) *participants who are identified as not meeting course requirements will be assisted with referral to appropriate support services*
- Complete an ATEC Enrolment Form
- Provide your Unique Student Identifier (USI). To apply for a USI go to <https://www.usi.gov.au/your-usi/create-usi>
- Provision of Australian legal photo identification for enrolment purposes

Site Induction

A site induction will take place to familiarise participants with the ATEC site ready to commence training the following week, at this time uniform and PPE (safety boots, safety glasses, welding gloves & welding helmet) will be available for collection.

Training Dates, Content and Location

Training will consist of 10-days, to be run over a 3-week period, commencing on the 13th of September 2021 in the north-west suburbs of Ottoway & Rosewater.
